The International Ocean Institute announces the Award of the Elisabeth Mann Borgese Bursary, 2011

Mr Noel Vella has been awarded the Elisabeth Mann Borgese Bursary (EMB Bursary) of the International Ocean Institute, consisting of a sum of USD5,000 to be used to further his research studies over one year.

Mr Vella, who is a conservation geneticist by interest and training and is currently carrying out research with the Biology Department at the University of Malta, will be using the Bursary to seek to provide more genetic data about the bluntnose sixgill shark, *Hexanchus griseus*. The methodology employed will focus on the use of genetic analyses to be conducted on a number of specimens sampled from the central Mediterranean so as to understand the population variation within the region with a view to working on species preservation. Furthermore, analyses of some specimens from distant sampling locations will be carried out so as to strengthen the scientific data while indicating the role played by the central Mediterranean population in respect of other locations.

The EMB Bursary is financed through the IOI's Women, Youth and the Sea Programme and was established as a means of demonstrating recognition to the host country of the IOI Headquarters – Malta – for hosting the IOI Headquarters and providing facilities for staff and offices at the University of Malta's Tal-Qroqq campus. The Bursary also constitutes a further recognition and acknowledgement of the role of Prof. E Mann Borgese, founder of IOI, and of her considerable achievements.

Also present at the award ceremony held on the 17th October at IOI headquarters premises on campus, were Dr Cherdsak Virapat, IOI's Executive Director; Prof. Alfred Vella, University of Malta Pro-Rector; Ms Veronica Grech, Registrar of the University of Malta; Prof. Salvino Busuttil, Host Country Representative on the IOI Governing Board; and Ms Antonella Vassallo, the Programme Officer at IOI responsible for the EMB Bursary.

Elisabeth Mann Borgese (April 24, 1918 - February 8, 2002), founded the IOI in 1972 as a knowledge-based non-governmental, profit international organization devoted to the sustainable development of the oceans and IOI works to uphold and expand the principles enshrined in the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea for the benefit of humankind as a whole, with particular consideration of the poor. The mission of IOI is to promote education, training and research to enhance the peaceful uses of ocean space and its resources. their management and regulation as well as the protection and conservation of the marine environment, guided by the principle of the Common Heritage of Mankind.

Malta is the host country of the International Ocean Institute Headquarters. As an island state straddling Mediterranean Sea, it has a long history of dependence on the sea as well as a strong tradition of maritime, and occupation. Its membership of the European Union confers on it an obligation to adhere to the European policies as well as to conventions and regulations which are global in scope.

Conclusion of the first EMB Bursary 2010

Bursary to Ms Alicia Said in 2010 was successfully concluded following the full year period with a presentation of the Bursary deliverables in the form of a research paper and financial reporting on the costs of implementing such research. The outcome of the research will now be presented for publication in a peer-reviewed journal and will also constitute the topic of a planned public lecture in the form of a presentation.

"Reflecting on Practice: A professional development programme for informal science educators."

The IOI-USA recently partnered with the University of South Florida Patel School for Global Sustainability to host a workshop presented by Centres for Ocean Sciences Education Excellence (COSEE) - California. Informal educators from around Florida came together to participate in the professional development workshop, "Reflecting on Practice: A professional development programme for informal science educators". The 3-day workshop was intended to teach informal educators how to more effectively communicate their understanding of and passion for the ocean realm to the public. Informal educators are those who teach outside the classroom in venues such as museums and aquariums and there are few development programmes aimed at this group, who are a vital link to bringing informed yet approachable science to the community. COSEE California has been a leader in the Ocean Literacy Campaign since 2002. This Campaign is a wide-ranging, collaborative, and decentralized effort by scientists and educators to build a more ocean literate society. The workshop was a group effort overall, it was sponsored and presented by the Lawrence Hall of Science, it was hosted and sponsored in part by International Ocean Institute-USA (IOI-USA), the Patel School of Global Sustainability and Coastal Areas Climate Change Education, in collaboration with COSEE Florida and COSEE California.





"I feel it went very well, all the attendees said that they thought they got a lot out of it and they got a lot of resources and tools to take back and teach their fellow colleagues and staff, which was the point," concluded Mara Hendrix, one of the key planners from IOI-USA.
