Pacem in Maribus XXXII

Core Programme

Forty years after the famous speech of the Ambassador of Malta, Arvid Pardo, at the UN Assembly, when the ocean seabed resources beyond national jurisdiction were proclaimed as forming part of the Common Heritage of Humankind, *Pacem in Maribus XXXII* will assemble in Malta in an endeavour to break new ground in its Conference series by engaging two new constituencies, Women and Youth, on whom the future of the Ocean so strongly depends.

The Conference will mobilise considerable skills, talents and experiences in order to advance and promote the sustainable use of marine resources and sound ocean governance. It will also move beyond traditional conference formats of reports and presentations by being more interactive with a greater emphasis on dialogue and broad participation. PIM XXXII will be organised around three themes, which will be of direct relevance to women and youth. To this end, it will explore how changes in the ocean are affecting the lives and livelihoods of women and youth and endangering their environmental patrimony.

The themes will be linked to panel discussions, parallel sessions, contributed papers and poster sessions, with a view to identifying new solutions, actionable outcomes and implementable results. The results of these deliberations will be incorporated in the Conference Proceedings and will help to shape the Conference Declarations. In line with IOI tradition, two public lectures will be featured as tributes to the vision and leadership of Elisabeth Mann Borgese, founder of IOI, and Arvid Pardo.

THEME 1 The State of the Ocean: Current Challenges and Future Prospects Implications for Women and Youth

This theme will explore such critical issues as climate change, threat to marine biodiversity and food security, marine disasters and coastal vulnerability, with special reference to their implications for Women and Youth. It will also attempt to develop new approaches and methodologies for the participation of women and youth in the management of ocean space and sustainable ocean governance.

THEME 3 New Solidarities for Sustainable Ocean Governance: Engagement of Women and Youth

Given the differences between realities, interests and expectations among women and youth in developing and developed countries, the conference would seek to provide a common framework for new solidarities and opportunities for socio-economic equity, as well as adjustments to current institutional arrangements and constraints that would empower both women and youth to become more effective participants. Greater emphasis will be placed on realistic and practical solutions and sustained follow-up action. It will thus facilitate an open debate where all views will be heard and commitments made with a view to determine what each of us might do in promoting the goals, objectives and outcomes of the conference.

A Youth Parliament and a Women's Caucus will be organised as a way of facilitating the conference objectives and to help frame the conference outcomes and declarations.

THEME 2 Involvement of Women and Youth within the Millennium Development Goals Strategies; Options and Challenges related to Ocean Protection

These sessions will focus attention on the ways in which women and youth may become more fully engaged in advancing the MDGs and promoting the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development. It will focus on the role of women and youth in the eradication of poverty through the use of ocean resources and in the protection of the marine environment. It will emphasise the need for curriculum development, teacher training and capacity building, through global training partnerships, towards the creation of appropriate employment in maritime and related services. It will also seek to find the most appropriate language for reaching all youth through the utilisation of new media as well as advanced tools for communication, public awareness and action.

The IMarEST Climate Change Debate

Join the great climate change debate! This will provide an opportunity for young scientists and engineers to participate in an afternoon of lively debate on the subject of climate change. Be part of a debating team and make your voice heard on burning issues such as:
Can marine engineers or scientists find the solution to climate change? Is the shipping industry playing an important part in combating climate change? Is the solution to focus our resources on adapting to or mitigating against climate change?
